# Letter from the Co-Executive Directors

#### DEAR COMMUNITY,

Four years ago, the Baltimore
Abortion Fund began a major
transformation—from a
volunteer-led effort to a staffed
organization. That decision
was rooted in a deep belief:
that community-based work
is powerful, and that when we
invest in local networks, we
spark change beyond our state
borders.

That belief has been proven right, again and again. Since Roe v. Wade was struck down three years ago, the Baltimore Abortion Fund has supported nearly 6,000 individuals across 43 states and 10 countries—more than three times our reach as a volunteerrun organization. We've expanded our partnerships with clinics, community organizations, and advocates across the region. We've added new services to

support more people, in more ways, than ever before.

Maryland has emerged as a place where abortion access is stronger than ever. This security is no accident—it is a direct result of unwavering dedication from our community of supporters, providers, and

activists.

The Baltimore Abortion Fund has been a bridge between people and the care they need for the past decade. And we aren't going anywhere. Our vision for the future includes deeper statewide coordination, more wraparound support for our callers, and positioning Maryland as a national model for abortion access.

We will continue showing up for our community for as long as it takes, because our fight has never just been about access to a procedure. It's about building a world where everyone has the power and resources to make decisions about their body and their future.

To everyone who has supported our work over these last ten years—thank you. You are part of every ride we coordinate, every abortion we fund, and every person who gets to move through the world with more freedom and less worry. The world we deserve is taking shape right now—and it's being built by all of us.

# Organizational Timeline

#### Sept. 2014

BAF is founded as a volunteer-led effort, providing financial assistance for abortion procedures in Baltimore City with a budget of only \$3,500 per month.

#### Nov. 2020

BAF receives a milestone capacity-building grant from the National Network of Abortion Funds.

#### Nov. 2021

Porsha Pinder and Lynn McCann-Yeh join BAF as Co-Executive Directors, becoming the organization's first paid staff.



#### **June 2022**

The Dobbs decision eliminates the constitutional right to an abortion. BAF experiences a 200% increase in client demand and raises over \$3.5 million.

#### **June 2024**

BAF staff grows to 7 full time employees.

#### Dec. 2024

BAF celebrates its 10-year anniversary.

#### May 2025

Maryland State
Legislature passes
bill to create a
public health

care.



#### Nov. 2018

BAF expands service delivery to include the full state of Maryland, monthly budget rises to \$5,000.

#### May 2021

BAF raises \$100,000 during its annual Fund-a-Thon campaign, realizing its largest fundraising achievement yet.

#### Dec. 2021

BAF expands service delivery to include its Practical Support program, offering logistical support with out-of-state travel, childcare, meals, and more.

#### **June 2023**

BAF programmatic budget grows to \$70,000 per month. BAF distributes record-breaking \$1.1 million towards clients' financial and logistical support needs.

#### Apr. 2025

BAF completes strategic planning, racial equity work and staff training, and prepares for organizational rebrand.

#### **Fall 2025**

BAF launches new brand identity, name, and website.



### Client Services Overview

The Baltimore Abortion Fund provides free financial and logistical support to reduce or remove the barriers between individuals and their abortion, assisting with all or part of the procedure costs, facilitating travel to their appointments, securing safe accommodations, or even providing warm meals during their stay. Our services extend across all 23 counties and Baltimore City, and we work

with clients who live in Maryland or are traveling here for care.

In addition to abortion access, we also provide support via our emergency contraception program, which discreetly mails free Plan B and contraceptive supplies to Maryland residents. We are excitedly preparing to relaunch the program in late 2025.



#### **HOW WE WORK**

- \* The client makes an appointment with an abortion clinic.
- \* They then call BAF to express their financial or logistical needs. Someone from our team calls them back within 24-48 hours.
- \* Depending on the need, we make a financial pledge to offset their procedure cost directly to the clinic where they are scheduled, or we coordinate their travel by directly booking flights and hotels or providing direct cash assistance for gas, meals, etc. Sometimes it's both.
- \* We operate on a limited weekly budget for funding and monthly for logistical support to maintain client support throughout the year. Clients are given pledges based on their gestational age and the total cost of their procedure.



# Case Study: Alex

Alex\* and their guardian contacted the Baltimore
Abortion Fund from Georgia seeking support for travel assistance for an appointment they had scheduled in
Maryland. Based on Alex's gestational age, this was their last opportunity to access care.

We booked a flight for Alex and their guardian and set them up in a hotel the day before the multi-day procedure began. On the morning of their appointment, they were turned away from the clinic due to a lack of funding for the abortion

procedure. They were facing an \$11,000 funding gap—above and beyond the capacity of BAF's weekly budget.

To avoid turning the client away and sending them back to Georgia, still pregnant, the BAF team worked with our incredible network of donors to crowdsource emergency funding, covering their remaining financial gap and ensuring that they could start their appointments the next day. We extended their hotel stay to cover the appointment length, provided cash assistance for meals, and were able to arrange for their flights home following the procedure.

## Case Study: Koi

Koi\* contacted the Baltimore Abortion Fund seeking financial assistance with paying for a medication abortion they had scheduled on the Eastern Shore of Maryland. The total cost of care was \$500, of which Koi had \$250 to put toward. Koi's support system was able to provide a ride to the clinic, a 60-minute drive from their home, but Koi couldn't afford to cover the gas and medication costs. As a full-time student, they were unemployed and had no reliable income. The BAF team was able to close the funding gap for Koi's care and provide gas assistance so they could make it to their appointment.


## Client Spotlight


"I have four children with autism spectrum disorder/ special needs and I cannot handle having another child. I made this decision for my own family and my own mental health well being."

# Client Spotlight

"I found out I was pregnant and immediately knew I wanted an abortion. My only problem was I had no transportation or support. The clinic in my city isn't performing surgical abortions right now so the closest clinic that was doing them was an hour away. I was depressed and stressed out for weeks before finding BAF. That very next day they found a volunteer that would take me to and from my appointment. I was over the moon happy and relieved. My driver was an absolute angel. He had snacks, blankets, birth control, condoms, ibuprofen, abortion information pamphlets, etc. I could go on and on about how amazing and helpful he

was. This organization has essentially given me my life back. It might sound a little dramatic, but it's true."

"Not having health insurance, I was extremely scared that I wouldn't be able to access care and forever be tied to my abuser. BAF helped me pay for the procedure and had wonderful volunteers that discreetly took me to my appointment. I never felt alone."

10 YEARS OF BAF!



In December 2024, BAF hosted Charm City Icons, a Baltimore-themed costume party to commemorate our 10-year anniversary. Our staff, along with 125 of our closest friends, celebrated the momentous occasion with a drag and burlesque variety show from local queer entertainers, Kenny Rooster & Friends.



**FUND-A-THON** 



This year, BAF brought silliness, summertime nostalgia, and the spirit of friendship to the National Network of Abortion Fund's annual Fund-a-Thon. Rallying around a "summer camp" theme, we gathered friends and families for a barbecue in the park, made friendship bracelets and sang karaoke, and even hosted the zaniest adult field day, complete with a pool noodle javelin toss. We were proud to recruit 65 community members to help us raise over \$122,000 an effort that made abortion care affordable for 245 more people.

#### LANDMARK LEGISLATION

In May 2025, Maryland will become the first ever state to create a public health abortion grant program, leveraging \$25 million of existing and unspent premiums for abortion coverage that are already required to be collected by the Affordable Care Act. This new grant program will make abortion more accessible for Marylanders, regardless of whether they have insurance coverage. BAF was proud to partner with providers, policymakers, and community members to provide both written and oral testimony in the Maryland State Legislature in support of this landmark bill.







## Supporter Spotlight

"My first interaction with BAF was for a fundraiser—the Bowla-thon! I was part of a team with some work friends and we had a great time. I work in abortion care, so I greatly value and appreciate how abortion funds like BAF help people get access to the care they need. I attended a few more fundraisers over the years and eventually decided that becoming a sustaining supporter was the way to go.

People need abortions all the time under so many different circumstances. I remember getting emails from BAF with requests for donations to help specific clients—"someone needed this many dollars by Wednesday in order to get an abortion." After a few rounds of those, I decided that I didn't want to wait until hearing about an urgent need. I'd rather give regularly in the hopes that the funding will just be there when people need it. Figuring out how to get an abortion—a time-

sensitive need—is already stressful enough. If a monthly donation can reduce that stress a little, it's well worth it.

Abortion access isn't just having a clinic or provider near you. It's also having the money to pay for care, the ability to take time off work, to have someone watch kids or have a place to stay if people need to travel. The stigma that still surrounds abortion care blocks people from getting support that might otherwise be available to them, and abortion funds like BAF help meet that need. Funds get people over hurdles like lack of insurance coverage, needing to conceal an abortion from family, or spending limited resources on getting to Maryland from other more restrictive states. Abortion can be life-changing in the best possible way, and helping someone get the abortion they need benefits our whole community."

# Organizational Refresh

Over the past eighteen months, the Baltimore Abortion Fund has been on a journey of deep reflection, growth, and transformation.

With the guidance of an incredible team of consultants, we have engaged in intentional racial equity work at both the board and staff levels, laying the foundation for a more just and inclusive organization. This work has included a comprehensive assessment, training for staff and board, and metrics for long-term accountability. We also developed a three-year strategic plan to sustainably expand our reach and capacity to serve more clients year-over-year.

We're also reimagining how we present ourselves to the community through an organizational rebrand. This includes a new name, refreshed values, a clear mission and vision, and a vibrant new visual identity and website, all set to launch in fall 2025.

While the heart of our work remains unchanged, these efforts position us for a powerful new chapter that aligns with our evolution into a fully staffed, multi-million-dollar nonprofit serving communities across Maryland while staying grounded in the grassroots, volunteer-led spirit of our Baltimore beginnings.
